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## Foreword

At the time I started compiling this bibliography, I was of the opinion that the thickness of the card catalog's subject category 'Antarctica' more or less accurately reflected the range and extent of Columbia's holdings relative to the South Polar regions. Consequently, I approached the task in rather a casual manner, stimulated primarily by my interest as a collector of Antarcticana and not as a scientist or even historian. As it turned out, the task was far more formidable than I had imagined; but I stuck to it with the idea and hope that the end product would be useful to some poor scholar, sometime, somewhere.

Although the Collections are well stocked with scientific and highly technical works of little or no interest to me (but which have been included, nonetheless), they are happily also rich in many of the classic titles of the great ages of Antarctic exploration which should make any collector envious: *Aurora Australis*, the first book published in the polar regions; Shackleton's *Antarctic Book*; many fine Captain Cook items; the delightful *South Polar Times*, written during Scott's two expeditions, and many more. The purchase of the fine polar library of the late Mr. Bassett Jones added significantly to the importance and uniqueness of the University's Collections, especially in the area of association items and presentation copies.

I had originally hoped to make this an extensively annotated bibliography, of the sort most useful to the book collector. Time made this wish impossible to realize: Perhaps some hardy soul could be induced to take it from here.

## Introduction and Notes

This bibliography was prepared during April, May, and June of 1972 in the Reference Room of Columbia's Butler Library. The Main Card Catalog--General, Topical Subject, and Serials--was utilized almost exclusively: Actual inspection of books was resorted to only with a few questionable titles.

During the bibliography's preparation, the following headings in the Topical Subject Catalog were inspected with varying degrees of success:

Antarctic (and all its subheadings and variations), polar regions, south pole, Heard Island, Wilkes Land, Weddell Sea, Little America, McMurdo Sound, McDonald Island, Macquarie Island, South Georgia Island, South Orkney Island, South Shetland Island, Kerguelen Island, Palmer Peninsula, Queen Maud Land, Ross Sea, BANZARE, British Antarctic expedition, Expédition antarctique française, Imperial British Antarctic expedition, Australasian Antarctic expedition, National Antarctic expedition, U. S. Antarctic Service expedition, Operation Windmill, International Geophysical Year, ice, glaciers, penguins.

Additionally, I cross-checked my own card catalog of Antarcticana (approx-

mately 1000 cards arranged alphabetically by author) against the University's General Catalog.

I'm confident that no general or historical titles of even the least importance have been missed. Some books with only partial coverage of the Antarctic--such as anthologies and collections of voyages--may have been overlooked. A number of purely scientific works may likewise have been missed. Conversely, the bibliography may include a few titles that have little or no direct connection to the Antarctic or the sub-Antarctic islands or seas. This may be especially true with some of the items pertaining to Captain Cook: Cook's second voyage took him south of 80° latitude, but I am largely unaware of the extent to which this fact is discussed in several of the biographic accounts listed. [Note: This bibliography does not include all holdings on Cook; only those likely to include consideration of the Antarctic.]

With perhaps a few exceptions, all items are listed according to the Main Entry as it appears on the catalog card. However, the Index (pp 65-70) includes all authors, institutions, and groups other than the Main Entry that appear in each listing. The normal format has been to follow the Main Entry (normally the author) by the title, subtitle, and information as to illustrator, translator, etc., the place of publication, the publisher, the date of publication and, if given, the copyright date, the number of volumes or, if one volume, the number of pages, and selectively any notes or explanations appearing on the catalog card. Following these, I've added where appropriate my own notes in italics. The Call Number appears in brackets in the lower left corner of the entry. If the Collections include more than one copy of the same edition, the Call Numbers are listed. If different editions, the entry is repeated. If the first entry includes notes as to inscriptions or other conditions unique to that copy, the Call Numbers of any additional copies of the same edition (but without the unique condition) are preceded by the notation: 'another copy.'

It will be noted that punctuation, capitalization, and abbreviations vary widely. This is explained by the fact that entries have been transcribed verbatim from the catalog cards.

An addenda appears on page 64 and includes several items initially overlooked.
